#### **Enrichment Activities**

Children are encouraged to participate in all of our church events as all forms of fellowship, service, and worship within the church are enriching to our lives as Orthodox Christians.

#### **SPRING SEMESTER**

**SUNDAY OF ORTHODOXY**—All children are encouraged to bring an icon for the procession around the church at the end of the Liturgy service to celebrate the Triumph of Orthodoxy.

CREATIVE ARTS FESTIVAL—Children in grades K-12 are invited to participate in the Annual Diocese Creative Arts Festival. They are encouraged to prepare a piece of art, whether it be a painting, drawing, photograph, poem, or creative writing piece, on the appointed theme for the year, to be submitted by the final Sunday before April 1st.

LAZARUS SATURDAY—After Liturgy all those in attendance may make palm crosses for the following Palm Sunday (lessons are given to learn how) and we prepare the Pascha candles.

#### SPRING FESTIVAL AFTER AGAPE VESPERS ON PASCHA —

lunch is served following the Divine Liturgy, and the children participate in an Egg Hunt. All those in attendance may make palm crosses for the following Palm Sunday (lessons are given to learn how), and the children may participate in additional activities.

MYRRH BEARERS—All girls in grades K-5 may participate in the Holy Friday Lamentations service as the myrrh bearers All they need is a white dress!



# **Church School Expectations**

Always remember we are in Church where the teachings of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ should be followed at all times.

- **BE AWARE OF CHURCH SCHOOL POLICIES**—They are outlined in this handbook. Realize that these policies are in place for the best interest of all students, parents, and staff members
- ATTEND REGULARLY—We encourage the children to attend Divine Liturgy and Church School regularly. Sporadic attendance brings limited comprehension, a lack of understanding, and weaker bonds with classmates and teachers.
- MEET THE TEACHER—Our teachers are very accessible and truly want to meet you. Make it a point to introduce yourselves to your child's teacher. They will be extremely grateful! Parents are always welcome to help. Talk to your teacher to see how you might be able to assist.
- **COMMUNICATE CONCERNS**—We encourage you to first communicate any issues or concerns to your child's teacher. After this, specific concerns should be addressed with the Church School Directors.
- PARTICIPATE IN ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES—Participating in the scheduled enrichment activities of the Church School Program, such as Youth Sundays, Christmas Caroling, Creative Arts, Fun Festivals, and other varied social activities, helps enhance the learning experience for students and brings a sense of belonging between classmates and within the church. Participation in all activities is strongly encouraged!
- VALUE RELIGIOUS EDUCATION—Each Sunday, ask your child what he or she is learning in Church School. Show your child by your interest and attitude how much you value their religious education. Your enthusiasm, or your indifference, can be very important!



# **Health Safety Protocols**

Disinfectant wipes and hand sanitizer will be available in each classroom. The tables and chairs will be wiped down after class each week. We will adjust our protocols following CDC guidelines.

# Church School Mission Statement

The mission of the **Saint Anthony Orthodox Christian Church School** is to partner with parents to provide a strong foundation in Orthodox Christian education for our children by developing a belief in God's presence in their lives, leading them to make a full commitment to follow Christ's example, and integrating them fully into the life of the church.

## Church School Core Values

- **WORSHIP**—Encouraging children to participate in community worship through the Divine Liturgy, cultivating a personal prayer life, and reading of the Scripture.
- **COMMUNITY**—Sharing in the total life of the church by gathering together in fellowship with others in the church family and showing love for one another in Christ.
- **DISCIPLESHIP**—Understanding what it means to be a follower of Jesus. Learning that loving God and loving your neighbor is a way of life.
- **SERVICE**—Using our God-given gifts and talents to serve the needs of others in and around the community in the name of Jesus Christ.
- **WITNESS**—Enabling our youth to express their faith to be true witnesses for Christ and the Orthodox Faith.



# **Enrichment Activities**

Children should always be supervised by their parents unless the children are actively involved in a Church School sponsored activity.

**YOUTH SUNDAYS**—once per month our youth help during the Liturgy with greeting, reading the epistle, offering collection, and handing out Blessed Bread.

ASK ABOUNA—once in the Fall and Spring Semesters each class gets to go to the church after Liturgy to spend time with one of the clergy to ask questions. It is a very popular time for the children.

**ORTHODOXY 101**—once in the Fall and Spring Semesters each class goes to the church after Liturgy to learn about the how's and why's of Orthodoxy.

#### **FALL SEMESTER**

**BACKPACK BLESSING**—In mid August students are encouraged to bring their backpacks to church to be blessed after the Liturgy. It's the start of the new school year!

**FALL FESTIVAL**—This fun family time is in late October. The children come in their costumes and play a variety of carnival games. There are prizes and, of course, candy!

CHRISTMAS CAROLING—On a Saturday morning in December, the SOYO youth go caroling together to spread the love of Christ and Christmas cheer to those who are unable to attend church regularly.

CHRISTMAS PRESENTATION—In late December, after the Liturgy, the students will perform a Christmas presentation and there will be a special Christmas get-together in the Hall including a visit from St. Nicholas and the Family Christmas Cookies of St. Anthony.



## **Church School Procedures**

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact your child's teacher or the Church School Directors.

**REGISTRATION**—All students attending Church School must be properly registered so the staff can be adequately prepared for each student. Any student who will be three years of age by September 1st of the current year will be admitted to the Pre-School class. All students should register in grades corresponding to their public or private school grade.

SCHEDULE—Church School begins immediately following Communion and ends at approximately 12:00pm. Students will remain in their classrooms during instruction.

PRIMARY STUDENT DROP OFF AND PICK UP—all children in grades PK—3 will need to be dropped off and picked up by a parent who will be given an identification sticker which must be shown to pick up the child.

CHANGING ADDRESS, PHONE OR EMAIL—Please notify us if your address, phone number, or email address changes during the year. It is important that we be able to contact you when necessary.

DIVINE LITURGY & COMMUNION—Participation in Divine Liturgy is the center of our faith, and students are encouraged to attend regularly. The children line up for Communion first and should be respectful, waiting their turn without pushing or talking, as to not distract others during this sacrament.

DISCIPLINE—It is expected that students are kind and respectful of others in the classroom. Misbehavior and disrespect, especially any bullying of other students, will NOT be tolerated as it denies others in the classroom the gift of learning. We want Church School to be a fun and joyful experience for all! A child who is disrupting the class may be brought back to the parents, at the teacher's discretion.
